

CHART OF THE MONTH: PROPERTY PRICES DURING COVID

Introduction

While we cannot predict what will happen with the housing sector post-COVID-19, there are some good indicators showing how the pandemic has begun to affect house prices across Oxfordshire and the districts within. As part of its monthly release, Land Registry UK has updated house price data at national, regional and local authority level. The latest available datasets have been used by the Data Service to produce an annual comparison of prices of all property types from March 2019 to March 2020. The property price change findings have only been taken from the first quarter of 2020; for a full annual comparison please refer to the supporting table section.

HOW MUCH HAS THE AVERAGE PROPERTY PRICE CHANGED SINCE COVID-19?

ALL PROPERTY TYPES


Key findings for all property types:

- The first case of COVID-19 was confirmed in the UK in January 2020. Between January 2020 and March 2020 the average property price in Oxfordshire has decreased by £7,319 (-2%).
- During the same period, Oxford has experienced the biggest drop of property price with a decrease of £34,411 (-8%) followed by South Oxfordshire with a decrease of £21,291 (-5%) and Vale of White Horse with a decrease of £12,620 (-3%).
- Although most districts have experienced a negative effect, Cherwell has seen an increase of £10,761 (4%) followed by West Oxfordshire with an increase of £1,664 (.5%).

Please note: The vertical axis in the following charts starts at £200,000 to better illustrate the change of property price overtime.



Figure 1. The linear chart below provides the monthly average property price for all the districts in Oxfordshire compared with the regional and national average price starting from March 2019 to March 2020.

SEMI-DETACHED HOUSES


Key Findings for semi-detached houses:

- Since the first case of COVID-19 Confirmed in the UK in January 2020, the average price of semi-detached houses in Oxfordshire has decreased by £17,456 (-5%).
- During the same period, Oxford has experienced the worst fall out of all the districts with a decrease of £42,386 (-8%) followed by
 South Oxfordshire with a decrease of £20,221 (-5%) and Vale of White Horse with a decrease of £11,642 (-3%).



- While most of the districts in Oxfordshire have registered a reduction in value, semi-detached house prices in West Oxfordshire have increased by £1,980 (.6%).
- Although semi-detached properties have experienced decrease in value, they remain £9,956 (3%) higher than the South East average (£347,738) and £124,793 (-35%) higher than the national average (£232,901).
