# **Self-Employment Income Support Scheme claims**

#### Introduction


The Self-Employment Income Support Scheme (SEISS) is a grant scheme managed by HMRC and it is aimed at provided financial assistance to those self-employed workers affected by COVID-19. This month's bitesize will look at the number of claims received for the second taxable grant as of 31<sup>st</sup> August 2020 for every district compared to the county, region and national averages. ### **Key findings**

- With 53% of the eligible population, the average take up rate for Oxfordshire was below both South East (58%) and England (60%) averages, Cherwell and Vale of WH were each slightly above the County average take-up rate (53%).
- The average claim in Oxfordshire was £2,900 and it was 7% higher than South East's average (£2,700) and 16% higher than England's average (£2,500).
- Cherwell had the highest rate of claims with 4,200 (54%) of the total eligible population, (7,800) compared to the rest of the districts.
- Oxford had the second lowest number of claims with 3,000 (53%) and it currently has the lowest number of the total potentially eligible population of all districts (5,600).
- South Oxfordshire had the highest number of eligible population with 8,000 and similar to Cherwell, it has received 4,200 claims, amounting to 53% of the total potentially eligible population.
- Vale of White Horse had (along with Cherwell) the highest percentage of claims with 54% of the total potentially eligible population (6,600).
- West Oxfordshire has the lowest rate of claims with 52% (3,300) and it has the second lowest eligible population compared to the rest of the districts.
- The highest average value claims were registered in South Oxon, Vale of WH and West Oxon, all with £3,000 which are above County, Region and England averages.
