

# Chart of the month: Eat Out to Help Out claims in Oxfordshire

### Introduction


This month's chart will explore the number of "Eat Out to Help Out" claims made by local authorities in Oxfordshire. The "Eat Out to Help Out" scheme aimed at incentivising customers by giving them a discount on premises where food is sold for immediate consumption. The scheme also incentivised food establishments on eligible days by bringing customers to dine during quieter times of the week. The scheme had also been used in conjunction with other financial supports such as the 'Job Retention Scheme' and 'Self-Employed Income Support Scheme'. ### **Key findings**

- The overall total amount of discounts claimed in Oxfordshire was £6,293,000 and it represents 8.7% of the total claims made in the South East region (£72,447,000) and 1.2% of the total claims made in England (£517,102,000).
- The average amount claimed by all districts is below national average (£10,200), and above regional average (£9,300) with exception of South Oxfordshire (£7,400) and Vale of White Horse (£8,700), both below regional average.
- The average discount per meal is lower than the regional average (£5.61) for most districts with the exception of South Oxfordshire (£6.28).
- Cherwell has the second lowest number of restaurants claimed (117), as well as the second lowest average claim per meal (£5.37).
- Oxford has the highest number of restaurants claimed (204), the highest total number of meals claimed (365,000), the highest total amount of discount (£2,041,000) and the highest average amount claimed (£10,000).
- South Oxfordshire has the second highest number of restaurants claimed (146), the highest average discount per meal (£6.28) and the lowest average claim per outlet (£7,400).
- Vale of White Horse has the lowest total amount of discount claimed (£832,000), the lowest number of restaurants claimed (96), the lowest average discount per meal (£5.06) and the lowest total number of meals (165,000).
- West Oxfordshire has the second highest total number of meals claimed (206,000), the second highest total amount of discounts claimed (£1,239,000) and the second highest average amount claim per outlet (£9,700).




Figure 1. Total amount of discount broken down by Local Authority


Figure 2. Total number of restaurants claimed broken down by Local Authority
