Background to the seminar series

- UK has a very high level of income inequality compared to other developed countries – also true here in Oxfordshire
- RSA Inclusive Growth Commission defines inclusive growth "enabling as many people as possible to contribute to and benefit from growth"
- Oxfordshire is planning for strong housing and job growth but concern that growth could compound the problem and lead to even greater inequality
- Oxford City Council, through its Oxford Strategic Partnership has championed putting inclusivity at the centre of growth plans
- Oxfordshire Local Industrial Strategy (LIS) now includes a commitment to establish an Inclusive Growth Commission to see how we can broaden benefits of growth
